BUSINESS AS Usual ...

Our February meeting is Thur. Feb. 4 at 8 pm. Our club is privileged to have ION HALDEMAN as our guest. Lon bicycled last year from New York to California and back in record-breaking time!! He will bring his slides and talk about his trip plus answer our questions. Please plan to come to meet Lon.

Also at this meeting, we will be deciding where we will be riding on our week-long trip in August. At the January meeting, several suggest ions came up and our ride questionnaire brought in more. As mentioned earlier, Norma Witherbee has volunteered to help someone else organize the big ride. Below is a summary of the suggested rides:

.. Northwoods of Wisconsin. Biking, camping & rafting. The idea is to travel in car pools to the Wolf River, spend the next day rafting. Then bike tour about one week the Tomahawk, Rhinelander, Woodruff area. Those desiring a longer ride can bike back to Arl. Hts. (Kurt Schoenhoff) Kurt would do the preliminary "legwork", writing for maps & making camping reservations. Emil Donkers & Bob Hinkle have mentioned they could map the route.

.. Coors Classic in Colorado. M.E. Spirek suggested riding in the area where this week-long race is held. Bikecentennial has mapped out routes which would be available to us. So no one would have to go out there to map a route.

.. Door County, Wi (with a sag wagon)

.. Great Lakes area

.. Mackinaw Island

It is important that anyone planning to go on this week-long ride attend the February meeting to vote and decide where we'll be riding.

Orion & Regina Osborne did some checking & received info on charter bus rates & Amtrak rates. It is based on mileage from the suggestions received on where to ride. 250 miles to Whitewater, WI; 500 miles to Apostle Islands; 750 miles to Finger Lakes; 1,000 miles to Denver.

Charter bus rates average \$1,500 per 250-mi. radius. Costs are based on round-trip. With bikes & luggage a bus could carry about 35 people:



What does cabbage, spinach, asparagus & broccoli have to do with cycling??? While reading through my "Complete Book of Vitamins" I came across this study done by Russian researchers at the Soviet Academy of Medical Sciences Mutrition Institute & Central Inst. of Physical Culture. VITAMIN E FOR ENERGY & ENDURANCE. Vitamin E gives a boost to the performance of athetes such as skiers and racing cyclists (in our case the touring and/or century cyclist) Demanding physical activity uses up Vitamin E much more quickly than ordinary activity. No matter how much you eat of the daily foods, too much E is processed out during cooking, freezing or canning to give us enough for strenuous cycling.

The most important factor about E is its antioxidant effect. It keeps pure oxygen available to the tissues for the production of
energy. You can measure your endurance potential in terms of available oxygen. E due to
anti-oxidant effect, can give the use of more
oxygen. Therefore, more wind and more
endurance. Reduced E levels result in the
inability of performance, even after a thorough
rest.. Suggested amounts for training periods:

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ - 2 hours — 100-150 mg 3 - 4 hours — 250-300 mg Vitamin E is found in: Cabbage Spinach Asparagus Broccoli

Wheat germ oil Cotton seed oil Safflower oil Peanuts

Although extra vitamin E may be needed for the physically active person, it is important to point out that a vitamin over—abundance can be just as harmful to the body as a vitamin deficiency.

We learned two lessons that day: never, never leave on a bike trip unprepared and bring along someone who is willing to do just about anything....


